




The International Baccalaureate (IB)

Admission

Eligibility

As Dutch International Schools are state subsidised international schools, admission is subject to conditions set in Dutch legislation.

Students within international mobile families, between the age of 4 and 18 can only be admitted to our school if the student complies with one of the following three conditions:

- The student has a non-Dutch nationality* and has a parent that is working in The Netherlands (or in a Dutch border region) for a limited time.
- The student has the Dutch nationality and has lived and gone to school abroad for at least two years because a parent was stationed abroad.
- The student has the Dutch nationality and has a parent (with whom the student will be living) that will be stationed abroad within two years and for at least two years. This is to be proven by a written statement of the parent's employer.

In addition, a student can be admitted to the DPprogramme (last two years) of Dutch International Secondary Schools if:

- The student has a havo-diploma or a certificate of promotion to year 5 in a vwo-school, and;
- The student can prove that he/she is sufficiently fluent in English, at the discretion of the international school.

All students that are enrolled in the primary section of International School Almere must reapply for enrolment into secondary school as according to Dutch regulations, the primary and secondary departments are considered separate schools.
